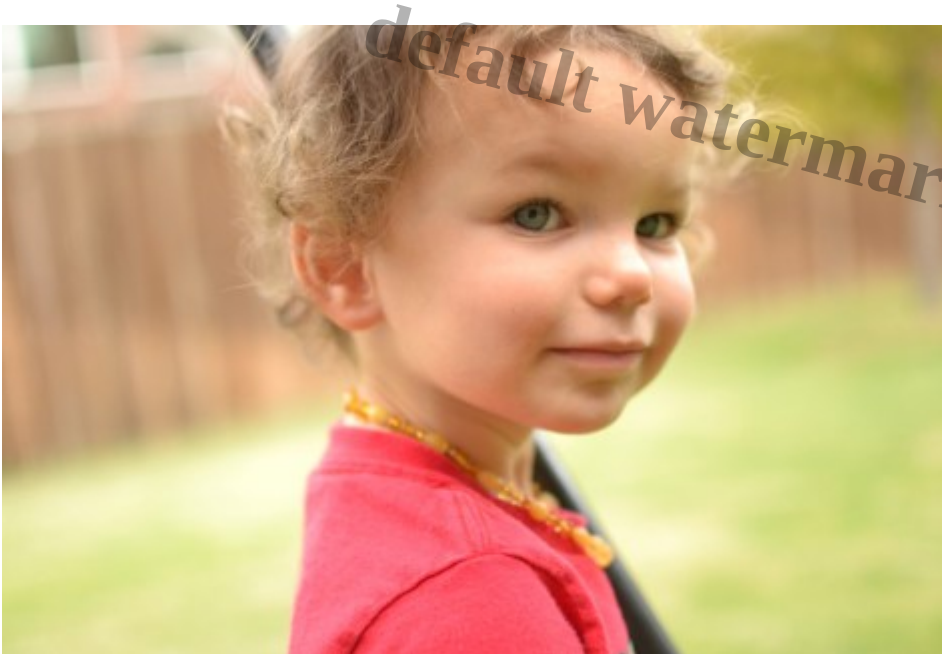


“Nothing Gold Can Stay” Debunked: #MySundayPhoto “ 08.23.15

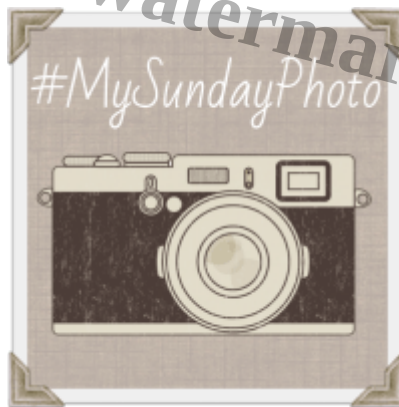
