Since your daughter is seven, I probably wouldnâ€™t feed her like I do Avery though. Just a tip. ðŸ™, *default watermark*

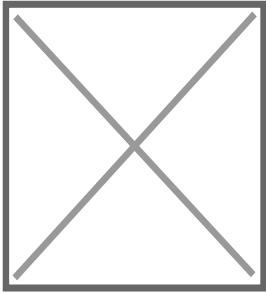
